Monthly musings from Rev Anne Potter

The summer season is a time for weddings, and we have had a few in our benefice this year. It is lovely that we still have couples wishing to come to church and make their vows in the presence of God. I also had the privilege in June of attending the Diamond Wedding Anniversary (60 years) of a couple which set me thinking about marriage and how things have changed in the last 30/40 years.

Nowadays the children of the couple are present at the wedding whereas 30+ years ago it was still a bit taboo to have had children pre-marriage. There were more couples coming from separate addresses whereas in the last twelve years of officiating at weddings I have only had about 5 couples who are not co-habiting.

Thirty plus years ago the marrying of anyone divorced was not generally accepted in the Church of England and it tended to be the diocesan Bishop to decide the policy. Blessings of such a marriage were allowed. Today it is technically in the incumbent priest's gift to decide if they wish to allow the marriage of a divorcee in their church. However, I don't know a member of the clergy who turns away anyone who is divorced unless for some reason the incumbent is uncomfortable with the circumstances of the divorce.

Now we have moved on and the latest debate within the Church of England is around a couple of the same sex getting married. The United Reformed Church (which came about as a result of the joining together of the Congregational and Presbyterian churches in England in the 70s) though welcome same sex couples to be married in their churches. Currently the House of Bishops is putting together some authorised prayers for blessing a same sex marriage whilst the debate continues. The two diocesan Bishops, Bishop John of Worcester and Bishop Martin of Dudley have put their heads above the parapet in declaring their support for same-sex marriages but have also clearly stated that they will continue to honour the current doctrines of the Church of England to which all clergy have signed up to obeying. Hopefully, though, in time the Church will embrace the love of two people whoever they are and allow them to be married in church. This may lead to the break-up of the Anglican Communion as we know it today, but things move on and change over time. This usually takes a lot longer in the Church of England!

Marriage is a gift of God in creation through which a couple grow together in love and trust. Love and trust being the operative words and on which a good marriage lasts for the whole of the couple's earthly life together. One of my favourite phrases of the marriage service is 'grow to maturity in love'. There are times when a couple, does not like the other person or the actions they carry out, but as long they always love each other the relationship stands a good chance of surviving the stresses of life.

And so we pray that the Holy Spirit will guide and strengthen all relationships that we may fulfil God's purposes to care for one another in Christian love.
